These visually stunning images captivate the imagination and deepen the connection between science and art. Each image in the collection originates from contemporary research at Northwestern in a wide range of fields, including medicine, genetics, chemistry, and engineering.

The winning images were chosen by an interdisciplinary panel of artists, scientists, and community leaders; professionally printed; and placed on exhibition to the public at the Evanston Township High School (ETHS) along with ETHS student artwork. Each year the ETHS Fine Arts Department and Physics classes are invited to create their own artwork or physics images based on the 12 Northwestern University Science in Society image finalists.
